PVWMA is a state-chartered local Agency formed “to efficiently and economically manage existing and supplemental water supplies in order to prevent further increase in, and to accomplish continuing reduction of, long-term overdraft and to provide and insure sufficient water supplies for present and anticipated needs within the boundaries of the Agency. It is anticipated that long-term overdraft problems may not be solved unless supplemental water supplies are provided. The water management Agency should, in an efficient and economically feasible manner, utilize supplemental water and available underground storage and should manage the groundwater supplies to meet the future needs of the basin.” This agenda is subject to revision and may be amended prior to the scheduled meeting.
